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



"Star Wars" is a long loved franchise by many, starting in 1977 and slowly growing to a bigger and bigger universe.



Teammates and coaches rushed to the twitching and smoking Franklin, but in one quick motion she sat straight up and said, "Wow! I feel like







"Um...not going to lie, I love Fortnite. I play it every day. When I start my day, I boot up a game. If I don't play for at least five hours in the morning, I'm not myself. Some people say I'm insane, but they just don't understand the grind. If I have an extra hour, I'm not gonna do my homework, I'm gonna boot up my Xbox."
